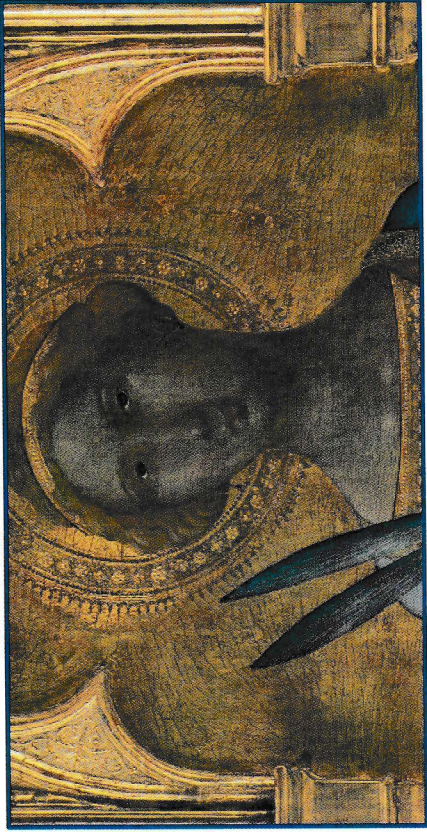


Yes, there's actually a St. Corona!

There is a saint in the Catholic Church who is the **patron saint of pandemics**, and her name is **St. Corona**. The church venerates her as the patron saint of epidemics and pandemics. The church celebrates her feast day on May 14th.

The word "corona" is Latin for crown. Ironically, St. Corona is considered as one of the patron saints of pandemics sufferers.

St Corona, a martyr of the Catholic Church, lived in the 2nd Century. St Corona is closely associated with St Victor. Together, the two were put to death by Roman soldiers around the year 170 AD.

There is a basilica in Anzu where the relics of St. Victor and St. Corona have been preserved since the 9th century.

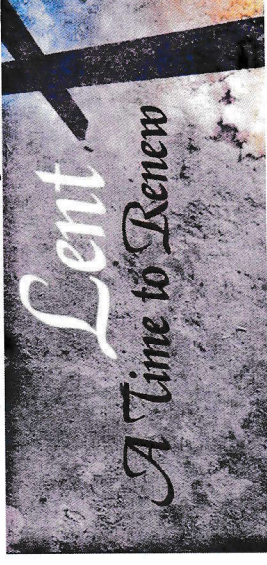

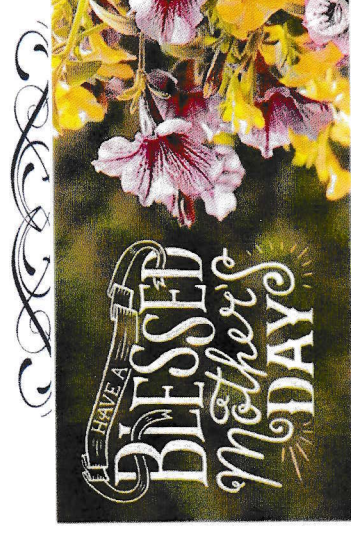
John 9:1-41.

LENT IS A TIME TO PAUSE

Pause a little: leave behind the unrest and commotion that fill the soul with bitter feelings which never get us anywhere. Pause from this compulsion to a fast paced life that scatters, divides and ultimately destroys time with family, with friends, with children, with grandparents and as a gift... time with God. Pause for a while, refrain from the need to show off and be seen by all, to continually appear on the 'noticeboard' that makes us forget that value of intimacy and recollection.
